Dear colleagues,

We invite you to take part in the 14th International Conference of the Russian Society for Ecological Economics “**Ecological and economic problems of development of regions and countries (sustainable development, management of natural resources)**”, to be held on July 3-7, 2017 in Petrozavodsk (Republic of Karelia).

RSEE-2017 Conference continues the tradition of the Russian Society for Ecological Economics (RSEE) to organize meetings of scientists, graduate and post-graduate students and professionals, where they discuss the results of basic and applied research on ecological economics.

RSEE was established in 1993. The Society’s Conferences have been held in Moscow and Irkutsk (1993), Pereslavl (1995), Novgorod (1997), Saratov (1999), Moscow (2001), on Lake Baikal (2003), in St. Petersburg (2005), Sochi (2007), Kaliningrad (2009), Kemerovo (2011), Irkutsk (2013), Kazan (2015).

The 14th conference in Petrozavodsk will be devoted to the discussion of topical issues in the field of sustainable development of countries and regions, methodology and practices of establishing and developing the economic mechanism of nature management and environmental protection, including payments for the use of natural resources and environmental impact, assessment and elimination of accumulated environmental damage, development of environmental target programs, management of ecological and economic systems, the problem of interactions between authorities, business and civil society, environmental safety.

Prospective thematic areas of the conference:

- environmental policy in Russia and around the world;
- economic instruments for regulating the use of natural resources and environmental protection;
- ecological and economic problems of development of northern and border regions;
- development of methods for estimation of economic damage from environmental pollution; elimination of accumulated environmental damage;
- interactions between authorities, business and the civil society in dealing with ecological and economic problems;
- environmental and economic problems of Karelia;
- the problem of resource- and energy-saving;
- the effectiveness of nature conservation activities;

- ecological-economic modeling in the field of sustainable development;
- economic environmental impact assessment and expert review.

Conference languages - Russian and English.
Interpretation will be provided during sessions.

The following awards will be given at the conference:

- “For outstanding achievement in research on Russian ecological economics”;
- “For the best conference presentation” (awards to graduate and post-graduate students)

Provisional day-by-day programme

3rd July – arrival and accommodation of participants. There are flights from/to Moscow, but exact

dates are not known yet. Railway station is centrally located, overnight trains from Moscow and St. Petersburg arrive in the morning. An evening commuter train from St. Petersburg arrives at 23-00. Express trains from Moscow arrive at around 16-00 (summer schedule not yet announced)

4th July – arrival and accommodation of participants, registration, conference opening, plenary session, standing buffet. Sessions will take place at Karelian Research Centre's main building, 11 Pushkinskaya St., Conference Hall on the second floor

5th July – plenary and thematic sessions, round table session

6th July – excursion (Kizhi Island)

7th July – sessions, round table, RSEE technical meeting. The venue will probably be Urozero tourist facility, 15 km away from the city

8th July onwards – extra excursions. Those with a valid visa can take a several-days trip to Finland. There is a rich choice of excursions, from short ones (Kivach waterfalls and Martial Waters spa resort, Ruskeala marble quarry, Rubcheila village, Karelian ethnic village of Kinerma, Shuja River whitewater tour by catamaran pontoon boat, Alexander of Svir monastery) to long (Valaam Island, 16-17 hours) and multi-day ones (Solovki Islands).

The conference programme and proceedings will be posted on KarRC RAS Institute of Economics website <http://economy.krc.karelia.ru> and conference website <http://rsee2017.ru>.

Conference proceedings (with UDC and BBC codes) are expected to be published before the conference begins. The proceedings will be linked to the Scientific Digital Library (eLibrary), and included in the Russian Science Citation Index (RSCI) with an ISBN. Hard copies will be distributed among participants at the conference. Non-attending contributors can get printed materials mailed to them by Russian post.

Submission requirements

The conference organizers can guarantee publication only for the materials matching the conference themes, highly original (checked by plagiarism detection software), fulfilling format requirements. The submissions must be thoroughly pre-edited for science and style. The authors themselves are fully liable for the accuracy and completeness of the information contained in the publication, as well as for the accuracy of citations and references. The papers will be published as submitted by the authors. The organizing committee reserves the right to select among the submissions to be published in the proceedings.

Submission will be accepted until 20.05.2017 at rsee2017@mail.ru.

NB! All authors whose papers will be accepted for publication will be required to grant "Non-exclusive license to use intellectual product", which is a mandatory requirement for any paper to be included in the science citation system (RSCI). Scanned Agreement of consent to publication of the text of the paper in RSCI database (2 alternative versions of the 'Consent' (for papers with one author and co-authored) can be found on the website and in Appendix 1,2) must be attached to the text. Where the required set of accompanying documents is missing or incomplete, the Organizing Committee is free to exclude the paper from the proceedings.

Format requirements

All materials submitted for publication in the proceedings should be e-mailed **in electronic format** at rsee2017@mail.ru.

1. Paper size maximum is 6 pages.

2. Prepare the text, formulas and tables in Microsoft Word for Windows. Word processor settings: 2 cm margins on all sides; font Times New Roman, size 14; 1.5 line spacing; full justification; paragraph indentation 1.25 cm; portrait orientation. All figures and tables should be numbered consecutively and supplied with titles or captions.

3. First page, left corner – UDC (see Sample paper format in Appendix 3);

- next line: **TITLE OF THE PAPER** (bold face, capital letters, centered);

- next line: **author(s)' full name(s)** (bold face, italicized, right aligned);

- next line: *scientific title, scientific degree, name of university, city or position, affiliation, city* (not abbreviated, italicized, right aligned);

- next line: *E-mail* (italicized, right aligned).

For papers with several authors repeat the above for each author.

4. *Abstract* 600 symbols (including spaces) maximum (italicized, fully justified, no indentation).

5. *Keywords* max five (italicized, fully justified, no indentation, separated by semicolon)

6. After 1 blank line repeat points 3-5 in English (excluding UDC).

7. After 1 blank line – body text.

8. After 1 blank line print “*References*” (italicized, centered). Below, list references alphabetically with consecutive numbering. In-text references to sources from the reference list should appear as respective numbers in square brackets as, e.g. [5]. Avoid automatic footnotes.

Registration fee for participants from Russia, CIS and Baltic States is 4000 roubles for researchers and 1000 RUB for students and postgraduates (if paid before May 20). The fee for participants from abroad is EUR 100. The fees for later registration and payment or payment upon arrival are 5000 RUB and 2000 RUB, respectively. The registration fee covers participation in sessions and meetings, coffee breaks, standing buffet, EN-RU interpretation, publication of proceedings, and excursion to Kizhi Island. Travel to Petrozavodsk and back, accommodation, meals, extra excursions are at surcharge. Participants unwilling to go to Kizhi Island on 6.07 (e.g. willing to go on another excursion) are advised to notify the Conference Secretary rsee2017@mail.ru, and a reduction in the registration fee to 1500 RUB will be considered.
